MANDALAY

You will find friendly crowd around the fitness equipment by the southeast corner of the Palace wall (at 26th and 66th St to be precise), opposite Mandalay Swan and Sedona Hotels.

The Taungbyon Nat Pwe festival is held yearly at Taungbyone, a small village about 20km north of Mandalay. Gay men from different parts of the country come here to hang out and enjoy. Held for a week during august, thousands of people from all over Myanmar celebrate the *Nats* (spirit mediums). The majority of Nats are gay men. People dance, eat, drink and the area are covered with food tables and shop stalls. Everyone celebrates and makes merry with a vibrant atmosphere. For all these reasons, all and many gay men await the festival.
